#### **EYFS - Red Class**

This half term has been all about stories! We have been getting to know lots of new and familiar characters and the different problems they face. The children have designed their own houses and reflected on what they think would make the strongest material by carrying out different tests. Next we visited the Three Bears House where more problem solving was needed to make three of each item, differing in purpose and comfort. Lastly, we were tasked to help the gingerbread man and how he could have crossed the river in a different way. We have been getting to know the structures of stories and the children have enjoyed retelling the stories they have learnt while also creating their own problems with solutions to ensure a happy ending. We have made porridge and gingerbread men, created wanted posters, bear masks and much more to help us to learn about our focus stories. In Forest School, we have been learning how to use bow saw and even made our own paintbrushes and paint! Enjoy your half term superstars and get ready for our last fun-filled half term together! Thank you to everyone who has attended our school events this half term, we know it has been super busy but we appreciate you coming in to the classroom and being so involved in your child's learning.

## **Year 1 – Orange Class**

Orange Class have enjoyed another term at school. We are really proud of children's hard work and achievements in phonics. In maths, the children have been able to make and share equal groups and can skip count in 2's, 5's and 10's. A highlight has been watching out bean, pea and sunflower plants growing. The children have been particularly interested learning about the Jewish faith. We hope you all will enjoy a fun half term and will look forward to seeing everyone back at school for our last term in Orange Class.

## **Year 2 – Yellow Class**

Throughout this last half term, Year 2 have been learning about the Stone Age and building their own Stonehenge. We have also been learning about plants and what they need to help them grow. We designed an experiment and planted our own seeds to observe how they grow in different environments. Yellow Class enjoyed learning about cricket and rounders in their PE lessons. In Art the children designed and created their own stickman worry dolls. We have also had our SATs week, the children did extremely well and all the adults in Yellow Class are very proud of them!





#### **Year 3 – Green Class**

At the beginning of this half term, Green class enjoyed a day on their bikes developing their skills with Bikeability. In the classroom, we have been learning about life in ancient Greece and made Greek theatre masks. We read about some of the adventures of Odysseus and wrote our own adventure stories. We have also been learning about volcanoes and wrote different types of poems about volcanoes. We have really enjoyed reading our class guided reading book, 'The 13 Storey Treehouse'. In art we have used drawing to develop characters in our sketchbooks and looked at how Quentin Blake uses exaggeration to create his characters. We created our own characters following on from this. In science we investigated rocks for their permeability and durability and in RE we have been reading the parable of the good Samaritan and thinking about how Christians act towards others to show they love Jesus.

#### **Year 4 – Blue Class**

This term in Science, we have been finding out about electricity. We have enjoyed making lights and buzzers work by making complete circuits with batteries and wires.

For the first time, Year 4 are learning to play the clarinet. It is quite tricky and even putting the five pieces of the instrument together is a challenge. We have all managed to play some notes. We have learnt E, D and C and have even played a tune!

We have also enjoyed having some more sessions of Forest School this term. Our favourite part was boiling water in Kelly Kettles and sitting around the campfire drinking hot chocolate.

Finally, at the end of term we all took part in our 10:10 morning. We went to different classes in our House groups and took part in a variety of activities relating to water.











## **Year 5 – Indigo Class**

What a busy term! We have loved our PE lessons and got to grips with bowling, batting and fielding when playing rounders and cricket. In music we have enjoyed using the glockenspiels to compose our own short pieces and learning about the pentatonic scale. The children have wowed us all with their amazing Legend writing about Beowulf and got into an interesting topic in our discussion writing: Should teachers be replaced by computers? Thankfully most came to the conclusion that they'd keep teachers. We have some budding mathematicians and we have learned lots of new skills with coordinates and translation. In computing, we have created out own 'choose your own adventure' style games, which test skills of hyperlinking. We have also begun our design project and learned a few stitches in sewing.





### **Year 6 – Violet Class**

This half term started with focusing on preparing for our SATs. The children did themselves proud in how they approached each day. We decided it was quite a fun week in some ways as we came in early and had breakfast together and we even had sweets on the tables to keep us going! But, Year Six isn't just about SATs and we have still had lots of fun. We have started to learn how to play the Ukulele and look forward to sharing our progress with you next term. We also had a visit from a real-life explorer as part of our learning about the Ancient Maya. Simon shared his experiences from many of his adventures and we particularly enjoyed learning about the South American animals he met along the way. In maths, we have been learning about angles, including improving our accuracy when measuring. We have also learnt about loss and profit and have been creating a bakery business, thinking about packaging, design, logos and ways of maximising profit. We are looking forward to baking our products next term!
