Ofsted's Development Points – October 2013

Point 1 – Ensure that teaching is consistently good or better, by:

making sure that work is always challenging enough, including for the more able demonstrating clearly to pupils what they are expected to do and meant to learn in each lesson.

Point 2 – Increase pupils' achievement, by:

making sure that pupils use what they have learned about sounds and letters when reading and spelling expanding opportunities for pupils to develop their literacy and numeracy when working in other subjects ensuring that pupils check their work and correct avoidable errors.

 Point 3 – Expand the role of the new subject leaders so that they have a greater impact on teaching and learning.
